The paradigm I hold is appreciative, where I believe that all human beings are oriented towards, and have the capacity for the betterment of the self. Inquiry and reflection are seen and used as essential tools for the enhancement of adaptivity towards a shared intra/interpersonal goal. Meaning and purpose (or the search thereof) form the cornerstone of this framework.
